Acceptable / Not Acceptable Advanced Continuing Education Activities for Maintaining Board Certification in Child Language

Acceptable Activities for Advanced Continuing Education

A continuing education activity is acceptable for renewal of your Board Certification when it is intermediate or advanced, is related to child language, and is a balance among various forms of education and across topics related to child language. Your continuing education should reflect your effort to continue to advance your knowledge, skills, leadership, and experience for all competencies in the areas of child language. The following are examples of the many formats for continuing your education:

Attending a session/seminar/webinar related to child language
1 clock hour / per hour of program

In order to maintain a balance of advanced continuing education, the following may also be counted, but not more than 20 hours in any one of these formats:

- Presenting continuing education that educates others about child language
- Creating a new course or revising a course related to child language
- Writing a chapter in a book related to child language
- Reading a journal article related to child language
- Writing a journal article related to child language
- Program development related to child language

Activities NOT Acceptable as Advanced Continuing Education

- Attending meetings
- Supervision of students or Clinical Fellows
- Teaching courses

Board Certified Specialists in Child Language are responsible to maintain a record of every activity participated in (refer to the *Continuing Education in Child Language* spreadsheet) to reach 100 clock hours in 5 years. Specialists are only required to submit certificates and supporting documents if selected to participate in a random audit.
